## **Silent Letters**

The letter k in the word *knitting* is silent; that is, it is not pronounced. Silent letters appear in the spelling of many English words. In the conversation below between two *English Teaching Forum* readers, there are blanks for some words that contain silent letters. Can you fill in the blanks with letters to spell the appropriate words? In each missing word, the silent letter is given to you. (For example, in "Don't forget to \_ \_ \_ B your hair," the missing word would be *comb*—the b is silent.) Numbers in brackets, such as [1] and [2], at the end of a sentence correspond with the answers you will find in the Answer Key.
